IV. Public Comment

A. Items on the Agenda: There were no Public Comments for Items on the Agenda.

B. Items not on the Agenda: Ms. Barrientos shared Associate Principal Nestor Espinoza and Dual Immersion Kinder teacher Luz Baeza were selected to be the school representatives for the Bilingual District Leadership Committee. Board members will be presented with a data report to show the strong outcomes Dual Immersion students produced in the CAASPP testing. Ms. Barrientos also invited Board members to visit the Dual Immersion classes.

Mrs. Poukkula expressed her concern regarding 5th grade teachers having students use classroom money when needed to attend the restroom. She is also concerned students don't have enough time to eat or attend restroom during

lunch recess and before going back to class. Students should be not be charged or penalized to use the bathroom after lunch recess. Another concern is that teachers are collectively punishing students because of a few students talking during class. Mrs. Poukkula also disagree with the school taking away recess time collectively from students. California code of education says you cannot take student recess away from them. Students should be held accountable individually and not collectively. Students need their recess time to decompress from the classroom or teacher. She suggested to implement an after-school detention program instead.

- We have a new 8th grade teacher Ms. Xochitl Munoz who replaced Ms. Stroebel.
- Our first ELAC Meeting of the year was very successful with 30 parents in attendance.
- Our SSC Committee also had their first meeting and school is planning to have one of the DAC Representatives or a teacher representative attend and give a report to DCS Board.
- September 12 19 Discovery started having Teacher/Parent Conferences and the goal is to meet with every parent to go over some initial data but mainly to focus on the child's strengths.
- Our attendance data is looking very good, as of September 9th we were at 98% since the start of the school year and we are 2nd in the district and are very proud of that.

Mr. MacGaffey presented that English Learners in the Dual Immersion program made a significant improvement, something to think about and investigate further what are those good things happening and to replicate and expand schoolwide.

Rationale: This is professional development for Discovery teachers who have not been previously trained in Guided Language Acquisition Design (GLAD.) GLAD is an instructional model that accelerates language acquisition and academic literacy in a culturally sensitive, language

functional environment to meet the needs of diverse learners, especially English learners, and target language learners in dual immersion. **Cost:** Registration for both segments of training is \$1,025 per participant, with up to five Discovery teachers participating. Total registration cost \$5,125, not to exceed.
